What's this Guide About?

If you're applying to university this year, you've probably put a lot of thought into where you'd like to study and the course you'd like to take, but you might not have thought about the additional financial support that might be on offer from the universities themselves.

Most universities offer scholarships and bursaries that don't need to be paid back and in this guide we present the income-contingent bursaries available. That is, the bursaries available to you when your household's annual income falls below a certain threshold.

What the income threshold is for a bursary, how generous it is, and whether it is paid beyond first year (subject to ongoing eligibility) can all vary by university, so it can pay to take a look at what they're offering.

In this guide, we've given you a head start by gathering together the information on income-contingent bursaries in one place so you can see what's on offer across the board. Many universities offer other scholarships and bursaries (e.g. for care experienced students, those with caring responsibilities or those with disabilities) so make sure to check university websites to see if you might be eligible for more money.

Am I eligible?

All income-contingent bursaries have a household income bracket or threshold that determines your eligibility for the bursary. In addition, you may also have to meet other criteria too, for example:



These criteria vary by university so you should take a look at the university website to confirm. Some universities also require you to meet, or give preference to, applicants who meet a widening participation criteria or who have been on a specific access course.




How to Read this Guide

In the rest of the guide we have included snapshots of information from each university; it will look like the fictional example below.

The information is intended as a starting point to help you compare what's of offer at different universities but you should use the QR code to find out more about the details.

FAQs

I don't know my household's income?

In most instances, universities will gather this information from Student Finance and so it's okay not to know the exact figure at this time. In order to get an idea of your income, it's a good idea to speak to the people in your household. If you're not sure what counts as 'household' income you can find out at www.gov.uk/apply-for-student-finance/household-income After you have applied for financial support through Student Finance England, they will ask people in your household to confirm their income and provide evidence.

Can I get more than one bursary from a university?

In a lot of instances you can only receive one bursary from the university so it's worth checking what else is on offer. Sometimes, for example, you cannot receive the NHS bursary and an income-contingent bursary. Ultimately, each university have their own criteria, so you should check their website and email them if you're still unsure.

Do I have to apply?

In most instances, you do not need to apply for the income-contingent bursary; it will be automatically given to you based on your household income assessment that is completed by your student loans awarding body. There are sometimes time limits on when you must have been assessed by and you can see these deadlines by visiting the university's website or contacting them.

What if I'm not eligible for any of the income-contingent bursaries?

If you are not eligible, you should check whether universities have other bursaries or scholarships that you could apply for.

Could the actual bursary be different to what is stated in this guide?

While we've tried to ensure the information included in this guide is accurate, it's a good idea to check with the university whether you're eligible for the funding. The current information available is for the 2024/2025 academic year and was compiled in August 2024 and so some things may change in the future.

I'd like to defer or take a gap year, will these bursaries be available to me?

The bursaries and scholarships available to you should be relevant for the year of study you're entering. Therefore, some of the bursaries available may change if you choose to delay your entry date.
